Early Intervention Therapy Program (EIT)

The EIT Program provides physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech and language therapies and counselling and family support for over 700 children and their families. Services are provided in the child's natural environments and focus on helping the child become successful in their daily routines and participation in home and community life.

Responsibilities

- Assess and diagnose communication disorders.
- Participate as a collaborative member of the team in planning programs responsive to client and family needs.
- Deliver therapy services to assigned clients, in accordance with family direction, professional standards and Centre policy.
- Under family direction, consult with others in the community, including teachers, SEA's, child care workers and therapists regarding client program.
- Attend staff meetings, case reviews, medical liaison meetings, regional meetings, departmental meetings and in-services.
- Provide appropriate client documentation in collaboration with the team.
- Provide statistical information regarding caseload as required.
- Prepare home and school programs for clients as appropriate.
- Provide information about communication disorders to other staff and the community as appropriate.
- Supervise assigned volunteers.
- Organize/attend team and school meetings regarding clients.
- Undertake additional responsibilities as directed.
- Provide externship placements for graduate students.
- Assume responsibility for professional development and growth.
- Adhere to philosophy, policies and procedures of the Centre.

Qualifications

- Masters degree from recognized university, with major emphasis in speech pathology, or speech and hearing science from a recognized institution
- Experience with children with neurological impairment and/or global developmental delay essential
- Experience in delivering community based services an asset
- Must be registered with CSHHPBC
