A Canada Disability Savings Bond can be paid into an RDSP until the year in which the beneficiary turns 49 years old.

CANADA DISABILITY SAVINGS GRANT

A Canada Disability Savings Grant is a supplement that the Government of Canada contributes to a Registered Disability Savings Plan (RDSP). Depending on the beneficiary's family income and contribution level, the Government may grant up to \$3 for every \$1 in contribution received by an RDSP in a year, to a maximum of \$3,500. The lifetime grant limit is \$70,000. A CDSG can be paid into a RDSP on a contribution made to the beneficiary's RDSP by December 31 of the year of the beneficiary turns 49 years old.
